These three people all have one thing in common: They benefitted from Mary Greeley Medical Center services and programs that receive vital support from private giving. You'll read more about these three and others in this 2010 Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation annual report on giving.

The past year has been amazing for the Foundation and for the medical center. The Foundation oversees more than \$9 million in assets and 86 funds, including 12 endowments. Last year we received nearly \$974,000 in gifts from more than 2,500 donors, and our Sponsorship Program attracted \$110,500 in gifts and in-kind support from 35 area businesses and individuals.

We distributed \$1.37 million, one of the highest levels of support to Mary Greeley Medical Center in the Foundation's history. But it's the impact of the gifts we receive that tell the story of how Foundation donors are advancing quality care at Mary Greeley Medical Center. For example:

- The Diabetes and Nutrition Education Center received \$750,000 from the Foundation to support construction costs for the Center. And our communities are already benefitting from two new positions, which were made possible by the generous support of the late William Burke during the recent Campaign to Reach, Teach and Treat.
- Israel Family Hospice House received nearly \$340,000 in funding which includes support to create a new music therapy program and a grief library.
- Birthways and Pediatrics received funding to acquire state-of-the-art lifesaving equipment for newborns.

Facility improvements, technology and equipment, and advanced training for our staff—gifts to the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation make all of that happen. As you read this report, we hope you will also take a moment to look over the list of donors. These are the people who are helping us advance health care for all Central Iowans served by Mary Greeley Medical Center. Please consider becoming a donor yourself to make a difference in the lives of our patients and the communities we serve.

Gifts of many sizes help advance quality care for newborns.

Miles Owen Nutini picked a good time for his arrival. It was a Monday evening in July when his mom's water broke, right in the middle of watching a reality show that even she admits was a waste of time.

Miles' mom and dad also picked the best place for his arrival: Birthways at Mary Greeley Medical Center.

"The experience at Birthways was great. The staff was very helpful and it all felt new and modern because of the recent remodel," says Wendy Nutini.

The Birthways birthing unit assists in the delivery of more than 1,000 babies each year. With that many little ones being cared for, Birthways is constantly upgrading its equipment and environment. These advancements, many made possible by private support, ensure the safety and comfort of newborns. At Birthways every gift—big and small—makes a tremendous impact on the littlest patients.

Rock-a-Bye

Like many new parents, Wendy and Dan Nutini attended classes on breastfeeding and childbirth (Lamaze). Part of their birthing class involved a tour of Birthways, including one of the recently remodeled private labor, delivery, recovery and postpartum (LDRP) rooms.

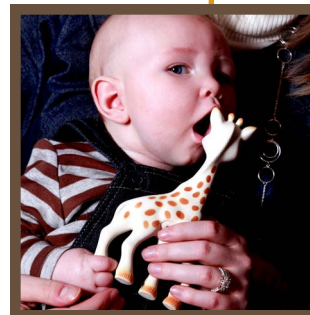
“The rooms were much bigger than I expected,” says Wendy. “We learned that we’d probably be in one room almost the entire time. That was definitely good news!”

These classes, as well as others on childbirth hypnosis, infant CPR and babysitting, are offered free of charge at Mary Greeley Medical Center. The Nutinis were so grateful for this service that they made a contribution for each class they took.

“We felt that was important,” she says. “It’s wonderful that they offer these classes at no cost, and contributing something is a nice way to give back.”

Donations like this continue to be a significant and consistent source of charitable support for Birthways. They make it possible for Birthways to acquire much needed equipment, like new rockers. Few things symbolize a nursery as much as a rocker. At Birthways such equipment has to be hospital grade, which means it can be more expensive than a regular rocker.

“Rockers are such a necessity. We like our babies to be in the room with their moms as much as possible, but when a nurse can rock a fussy baby in the nursery for a while, it can provide some much-needed relief to a new mom,” says Nyla Carswell, R.N., B.S.N., M.P.A., director of Maternal and Child Services.



Critical Equipment

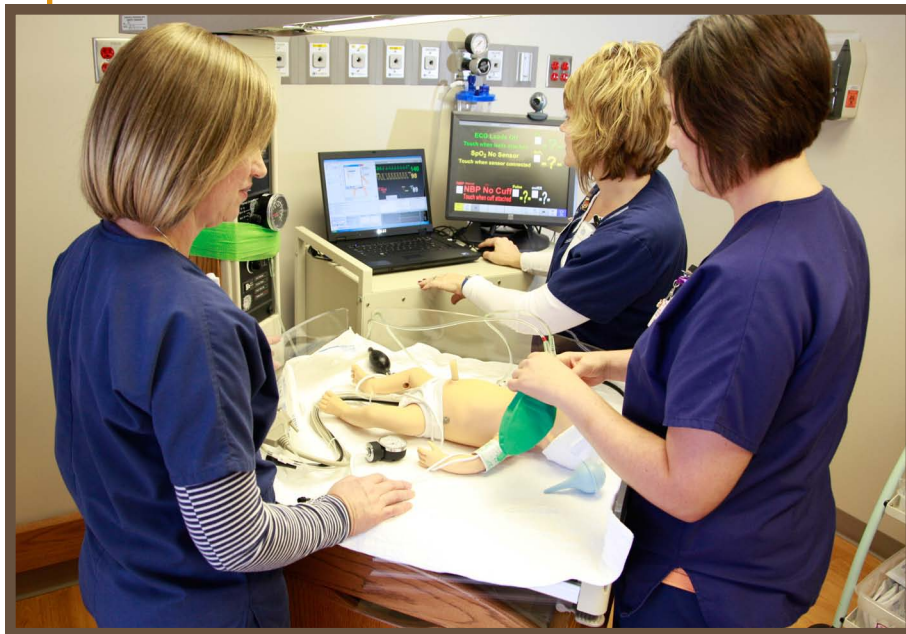
Nutini had no trouble during her delivery. Miles was a healthy 9 pounds 6 ounces. But if a birth does have complications, Birthways is ready.

That’s because the unit is certified in the Neonatal Resuscitation Program, requiring its entire staff to be trained to use special equipment for the delivery of newborns.

Thanks to a grant last year from Variety—The Children’s Charity, Birthways was able to purchase state-of-the-art equipment that is critical to neonatal resuscitation. Safety is also enhanced because it means the resuscitation equipment is all the same make and model.

“Having standardized equipment is vital to the care at Birthways, because it means our nurses need to know how to use one style of equipment, instead of several different ones,” says Carswell. “Variety is a wonderful partner. We’re honored to be part of their efforts to help the children of Iowa.”

A State-of-the-Art Baby

Like all healthcare professionals, the staff of Birthways is constantly honing their skills to ensure the safety of their patients. But patients this small present unique training challenges.

Enter SimNewB™, an incredibly life-like neonatal patient simulator. She’s the latest piece of medical technology and her purchase was made possible through funding from the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation.

This realistic doll, connected to a computer, allows staff to practice the safe and proper use of real life-saving equipment, such as ventilators. She’s high-tech but with a variety of realistic features, including an airway, a chest that goes up and down with each breath, and a mouth with a soft tongue and tissue. At the click of the mouse she can cry and make other typical baby sounds, from normal breathing to gurgles.

Most importantly she can simulate the behavior of a baby in distress, which is essential to the continued training

of Birthways staff. Her programmable heartbeat and breathing allow staff to respond to a variety of realistic situations. Her heartbeat may indicate pulmonary stenosis or systolic murmur, her sounds may indicate choking or pneumonia, and she can even turn blue around the mouth when she’s not getting enough oxygen.

“This training used to be done through lectures and videos, and practice with a doll wasn’t nearly as lifelike,” says Carswell. “SimNewB™ represents a real advancement in training that is crucial for patients.”

Updated facilities, state-of-the-art equipment and continued training all contribute to the quality of care delivered, and all are impacted by philanthropic support.

“It’s so encouraging for the staff to see that people take an interest in Birthways and support it,” says Carswell. “These contributions—big and small—provide the tools and equipment we need to take care of our patients, as well as contribute to a positive, productive work environment.”

A Final Tribute

A husband's act of love has a lasting impact.

In Memory of
Janet S. Jewell
From Her Family

Paul Jewell fondly remembers that special visit he made to the Israel Family Hospice House with his dad, Harold, and his two siblings. The Jewell family wasn't there to visit a loved one, but to view a plaque on the wall engraved with the name of Janet Jewell, Harold's late wife and the mother of their three children.

Paul knew that plaque was meaningful, but he didn't know how truly significant it was until after his father died in 2008.

"We knew he was giving something in his will in honor of our mother, but we didn't know how much until after he passed," says Paul. "When we learned how big the gift was, I thought, 'Wow, Dad! Way to go.'"

An Amazing Woman

Janet Jewell lost her courageous five-year battle with breast cancer in 1998.

"She was happy-go-lucky right up to the day they discovered she had breast cancer," Paul says of his mom. "But she continued to be defiant of the prognosis because she had things she wanted to do. She charged ahead, which was always amazing to my dad."

Harold decided to make a lasting tribute to his late wife and, in 2009, Mary Greeley Medical Center received a deferred gift in excess of \$100,000 from his estate. The gift was designated to the Israel Family Hospice House endowment in Janet's memory. Although neither Harold nor Janet ever used hospice, "they both believed in it and people getting dignified care and being comfortable at that point in their lives," says Paul.

Janet was known to many as an engaging and energetic speech therapist with the Area Education Agency. As a

volunteer at Mary Greeley Medical Center, Janet helped start the Tickle Bone Trolley, a cart filled with feel-good books and movies that she would deliver to patients.

"It was her passion. She loved books and movies, and she'd storm into rooms saying, 'Oh you have to watch this or read this ... stay away from that negative stuff,'" says Paul. "But what was so interesting is that she was a cancer patient herself, and may have been in worse shape than some of the people she was visiting."

Enduring Gifts

Harold's final act of love for his wife follows a rich tradition of deferred gifts to Mary Greeley Medical Center. Over the years deferred giving has made a tremendous impact on the medical center's ability to provide quality care and health education to the communities it serves.

- A gift from Frank and Bessie Strathman established the endowment to support the Israel Family Hospice House. This year the Strathman Endowment provided nearly \$330,000 in support.
- Bessie Myers supported the construction of Bessie Myers Auditorium, which is used for a variety of educational programs and events.
- Don and Beverly Bock supported the Cancer Resource Center, which helps cancer patients and their families.

FOR THE Benefit of All

Philanthropic support has wide impact at Mary Greeley Medical Center.

Every Mary Greeley Medical Center patient and visitor is touched in some way by private support given to the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation. Here are just a few examples of how people have benefited from programs, technology and staff training made possible by the Foundation.



Tools to Help a Child Cope with Loss

Little Lydia Maas absolutely adored her grandpa, and when he entered **Israel Family Hospice House** she had many questions.

“The whole thing was very intriguing to her, but she’s not the kind of child you can just give regular, routine answers to,” says Lydia’s mom Robin Maas. “I knew your basic book just wasn’t going to cut it.”

To find what Lydia needed, Maas turned to Israel Family Hospice House, which has a constantly growing collection of resources to help people cope with the loss of a loved one. Now, with support from the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation, those resources have been organized into a grief library.

“The library serves the whole community, from our patients and their families to people who visit us looking for help coping with the loss of a loved one,” says Cindy Edge, R.N., B.S.N and HOMEWARD Hospice manager.

Located in the lobby of hospice house, the library is available to the public and offers more than 100 resources for adults and children, including relationship-specific

books not available in most public libraries and games to help teenagers open up about their grief.

“Not everybody is able or wants to go to a support group. Not everyone has access to the Internet,” says Bonnie Ripenhagen, bereavement coordinator. “That’s why the library is here, and why it’s designed to serve specific grieving situations.”

Maas, an elementary school teacher, has referred colleagues to the library, and continues to use it herself.

“Lydia still asks a lot of questions, and sometimes she cries because she misses grandpa, like we all do,” says Maas. “But hospice has these wonderful guides that explain how to phrase questions and answers for kids. They’ve been such a help for me.”

The Foundation also helped launch the new HOMEWARD Hospice music therapy program. Music improves the quality of hospice care because it connects with people on so many levels, from childhood memories to religious faith, says Edge. It is particularly beneficial for people with dementia, but can also help hospice patients who have a musical background and children who are dealing with the grief of losing a loved one.

“It’s an awesome privilege to be able to use Foundation funds to offer these programs for our patients and their families,” says Edge.

A Coach When You Need One

Even after six decades of successfully managing his diabetes, Alan Ruther still needs help now and then.

That's why Ruther, an Ogden native, frequently travels to Mary Greeley Medical Center's **Diabetes and Nutrition Education Center** in Ames for friendly advice from highly skilled experts.

The Center provides a comprehensive diabetes management program for children and adults, helping those with known conditions as well as newly diagnosed patients. Since it was organized in 1978, the diabetes education program has continued to grow, most significantly in the last few years. This is largely thanks to a successful \$1.9 million campaign launched by the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation. In January 2010, the medical center was presented with a check for \$750,000 to support the construction of the diabetes center, making it the largest area to receive Foundation support this year.

Ruther is retired from the Iowa Department of Transportation and takes full advantage of the Diabetes and Nutrition Education Center's many services and programs.

"Barb Fatka has been an inspiration," says Ruther of the coordinator of the Center. "There've been times when I've slipped a little bit, haven't done quite as much as I should have. But she's always been there. She's like a coach. Even if you're winning the game, you need that encouragement and support to really go get 'em."

Ruther's wife, Jo Ann, benefits from this level of personal care too.

"After Alan had his heart attack [in 1998] his blood sugars were up and down. I was scared to death I'd do something wrong, but Barb told me I could call her any time of the day or night. And I did," Jo Ann says. "She goes out of her way to be there for us."

Advancing Knowledge

One way to ensure quality care is to help current and future caregivers get the training they need. Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation does this through support for a variety of programs, including:

Certifications

Thirty-one Mary Greeley Medical Center nurses earned specialty certifications last year, bringing the total number of certified nurses to 107.

"The certification I earned in cardiovascular nursing allowed me to grow professionally and provide care for a wider variety of patients," says Cheryl Pietz, R.N., B.S.N. and manager of the Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory. "It also helps me serve as an example for others on the nursing staff who can see the benefits of certification."

Grand Rounds

Forty-four Grand Rounds educational forums were offered last year. Guest speaker topics included cardiovascular management for non-cardiologists; prostate cancer prevention; advance directives and DNR orders; complications of pediatric obesity; and minimally invasive surgery techniques.

Scholarships

Six scholarships were awarded last year to outstanding area students who plan to pursue careers in healthcare. Next year, the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation will award two additional scholarships supported by the Mary Greeley Medical Center Auxiliary. The scholarships honor Mary Ann Carr and Linda Dasher for their more than 30 years of service to the medical center Gift Shop.

Cancer's Shock Eased for Patients and Families

Michelle Flattery got a stunning diagnosis from her doctor in January 2010: non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.

"A new year was just starting and then boom," says Flattery. "It shocked everyone. I'm an aerobics instructor, I'm a healthy person."

She had surgery a few days after receiving the news, followed by chemotherapy and radiation treatments. Those ended in July and a November checkup indicated she was cancer-free.

But in the months following her surgery, Flattery, like other cancer patients, found the support she needed at Mary Greeley Medical Center's **Cancer Resource Center**. Part of the William R. Bliss Cancer Center, the Cancer Resource Center is funded by gifts to the Mary Greeley Medical Center Foundation.

"We're able to provide incredibly valuable services to cancer patients and their families all because of generous private support," says Mary Ellen Carano, Center coordinator.

The Center, which is free and open to the public, offers a variety of services, including books and media on every

aspect of cancer and treatments; a boutique with wigs, hats, prosthetics and other specialty supplies for cancer patients; genetic risk education to assess inherited risk for certain cancers; and cancer support groups.

"What really helped me were all the resources on lymphoma, especially all the pamphlets from the American Cancer Society," says Flattery. "Everything I needed was there. It was great to have a place to go to for some extra help and support."

Flattery and her husband Paul knew their three young children would be worried and confused about what was happening to their mom. The Flatterys know many people who have faced cancer, including Michelle's mom, a 22-year breast cancer survivor.

"We've always had this word 'cancer' in our lives, and we were able to say it's not always a bad thing ... just look at Grandma," says Flattery.

Still, they went to the Center to find books to help the kids, including a workbook for children with a parent who has cancer. Flattery's 10-year-old daughter Callie recorded her feelings about her mom's cancer in the workbook and even did a sketch that inspired t-shirts that Flattery's co-workers at Ames Racquet and Fitness had made for each member of the family.

The Center also offers a variety of classes for cancer patients, including a class on exercise and cancer that Flattery attended.

"It's nice to be able to connect with other people who are going through what you are," she says.

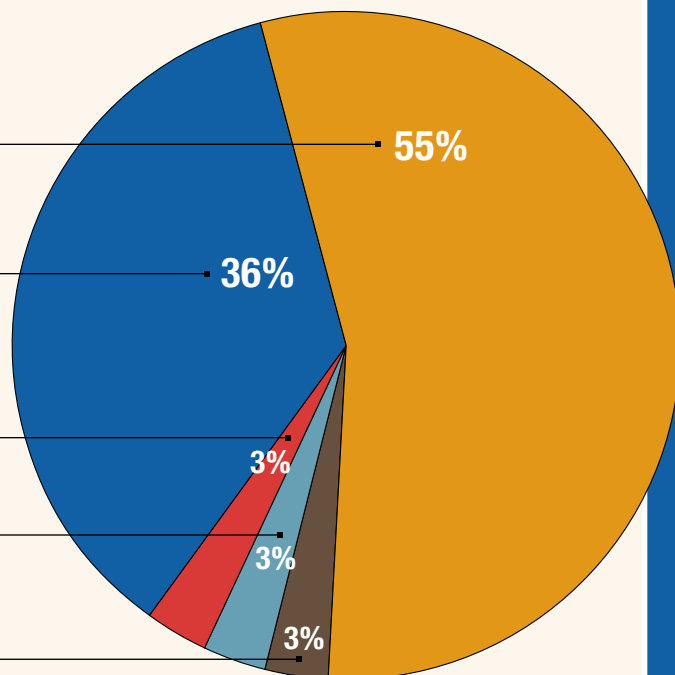
